Was Indus Valley civilisation impacted by a meteorite?



Radiocarbon dating of samples of melt-rocks (L) which are parts of the meteorite discovered at the Luna site in Kutch (R)

The 4th crater to be discovered in India, in Kutch, is 200km from the Indus site of Dholavira. A Kerala university team says the impact was around the time the civilisation was flourishing.



took researchers from the geology department of Kerala University four years to nit paydirt – as science calls it. The team hit on melt-rocks, which are parts of a meteorite in the hamlet of Luna, in Kutch,

Radiocarbon dating of these melt-rocks show the meteorite impact may have happened around 6,900 years ago, roughly the period the Indus Valley civilisation was flourishing in this area. The intriguing question for researchers is whether the meteorite had any impact on Indus Valley. The impact location is 200 km away from the famous Indus Valley site of Dholavira.

Luna is the impact site but the famous Indus Valley excavation site is about 200 km away. There's a 2 km crater in the place and the meteor that impacted must be about 200-400 m in diam-

he world's first electric hydro foiling passenger ship has satisfactorily completed its trials in Stockholm. The sustainable vessel Candela P-12 uses computerised information to elevate its hulls above the water friction.

In its first flight, Candela P-12 reached a speed of 30 knots, which is quite an achievement for an electric passenger vessel. The secret to its high speed and long range are the three carbon fiber

wings that extend from under the hull. These active hydrofoils allow the ship to lift itself above the water, thus decreasing drag.

AMMA: What is it Sudha, you seem to be very happy?

SUDHA: I've been chosen to represent my school in the district athletics meet next month. Only four students from my school have been chosen and I'm one of them.

AMMA: Very good Sudha. Do well and make us all proud. 0k? SUDHA: Ok amma.

PT SIR: Sudha, Ramya, Varsha and Veena, you've all been chosen to represent our school at the district athletics meet. For the next one month, we will be practising every day. All of you must work hard to win a medal for our school. Finish your warm-up and come, we will do a mock race.



SHAKESPEARE USED IN EVERYDAY ENGLISH

ay-to-day English is full of words and idioms created by the Bard. Some of these expressions were not created by Shakespeare, but he made them incredibly popular and brought them to our days. Do you want to know what idioms you use are a living testimony of the genius of William Shakespeare?

1BREAK THE ICE: In case you don't know, breaking the ice means to start getting to know people, avoiding social awkwardness and formality, and becoming more relaxed with a person whom you have not met earlier. Break the ice as a metaphor made its first appearance in 'The Taming of the Shrew' (Act 1, Scene 2) as a term for a social gesture:

DEAD AS A DOORNAIL: This Lidiom is used to indicate that

something is lifeless. "As dead as a doornail" is a very old English phrase that Shakespeare used and popularized in Henry IV Part 2.

KNOW YOUR IDIOMS

IN A PICKLE: This idiom is used **5**to refer to a difficult situation or a troubling quandary. Shakespeare associated drinking too much to troubles, and if you think about it makes sense, since many pickling processes use alcohol.

ANIGHT OWL: Are you a night owl? If you heard someone calling themselves or others "a night owl", you know this expression is used to refer to people who stay up late at night or goes to bed late. At first "night owl" and "owl" were synonyms. Its figurative use as a reference to people began in the 16th century.

Shakespeare used it in 1594 in 'The Rape of Lucrece'.

5to CATCH A COLD: I know, I know, crazy, right? Whenever you complain about a flu, you're talking Shakespeare! The Bard came up with the idea that cold caused illness for the first time in 'Cymbeline' (Act 1. Scene 4).

TO LIE LOW: To conceal oneself; Oto remain hidden. Even though many variants existed since the 13th century, Shakespeare used it in its present form in 'Much



Assefa ran Chicago in a shoe, retailing at just under \$500. It conforms to the 4cm height rule but, at 138 grammes, weighs about 40% less than any previous racing shoe. The latest theory around the shoes is that the carbon plates have only a limited effect and it is the "barely-there" weight, combined with the energy-return cushioning and "rockers", that prevents the fatiguing impact of previous thin-soled "racing flats" and allows athletes to maintain their optimum speed for longer.

Kiptum achieved his record in yet another prototype, also worn by women's Chicago champion Sifan Hassan, who took almost five minutes off her personal best with the sec-

ond-fastest women's time ever of 2:13.44. It was a similar story in several athletics events at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics where a combination of a fast track and revolutionary spikes produced some jaw-dropping records.






INDIA ANNOUNCE 6-MEMBER SQUAD FOR DAVIS CUP
